EDITORIAL - Innovative insights, ahead of their time by Roland Pochet, PhD, Board Member of the BBC

One of the strengths of the Belgian Brain Council lies in its ability to disseminate cutting-edge scientific information to its members and associates—frequently prior to its formal acknowledgment. Two recent instances illustrate this.


In Newsletter No. 39, published in February 2021, we emphasized the remarks of Philippe Aghion, who was then a professor at the Collège de France and Harvard, during a conference focused on innovation in the development of COVID-19 vaccines.

Philippe Aghion emphasized the cultural distinctions between Europe and the United States regarding innovation, underscoring the necessity of an ecosystem that fosters experimentation and risk-taking—crucial elements for scientific creativity.

Four years later, the 2025 Nobel Prize in Economics has unequivocally validated this vision, affirming the significance of the ideas shared with our community at that time.



In our most recent Newsletter No. 76 (August-September 2025), we emphasized the significant advancements regarding the role of resident memory CD4+ T lymphocytes (Trm) in progressive multiple sclerosis, an area that remains relatively underexplored.



This work holds particular significance today, as the 2025 Nobel Prize in Medicine recognizes essential research into the mechanisms of immunity. Once more, we have anticipated the global scientific developments.

These two examples exemplify our mission: to inform, connect, and inspire regarding advancements in brain science.

We will persist in sharing this prospective monitoring with you, situated at the intersection of research, clinical practice, and innovation, ensuring that the Belgian Brain Council remains a forum for exchange where contemporary ideas evolve into future discoveries.

The "50 Mandates" campaign has been initiated.

Phase IV of the project commenced due to the swift and enthusiastic engagement of seven partners from the pharmaceutical industry: **BMS, EISAI, IPSEN, Janssen, SERVIER, TAKEDA,** and **UCB.**

Four additional companies (**Lilly, Lundbeck, Pfizer, and Sanofi**) are pending decisions from their selection committees.

Four patient associations—Alzheimer Europe, APEPA, Hersenletseliga, and Whiplash—have already responded positively and expressed a strong interest in enhancing the education of their members and securing signatures (consent and mandate).

To assist patients throughout this process, Marina Bassas, a young neuropsychologist, has been appointed by the BBC, effective November 1st.

We extend our heartfelt gratitude to our sponsors for their generous support.

The BBC's budget for 2025 was ratified at the General Assembly on September 29.

This budget of €59,000 is allocated into three segments: 44% for the ordinary budget, 31% for the 20th anniversary of the BBC, and 25% for phase III of the Belgian Brain Plan, including the development of the European Brain Data Hub within this framework.

The Federal Parliament organized an event focused on enhancing the quality of life and facilitating the reintegration of individuals affected by brain tumors. This initiative stems from a collaboration among the patient association "Brain Tumors," the Belgian Society of Neurosurgery (BSN), the Belgian Association for Neuro-Oncology (BANO), the Belgian Brain Council (BBC), and the Patient Expert Center (PEC), with the backing of Servier. Members of Parliament Kathleen Depoorter (N-VA) and Daniel Bacquelaine (MR) also endorsed this initiative.



On this occasion, Lia Le Roy (Vice-President the BBC) of and Professor Dirk Van Roost addressed the audience to present philanthropic association and its role in the collaborative development of brain health policies.
